#### **DIRECTOR'S REPORT**

Mr. Gomez gave the following update:

- School Counselor BPA now has a full-time counselor, he started today- April 17, 2023.
- New Site two facilities have been identified for BPA's future permanent site.
   The process of getting a new building ready can take up to 2 years.
- Enrollment 128 students are currently enrolled; next year BPA will enroll an extra 15-20 6<sup>th</sup> graders (no applications will be accepted for 7 or 8<sup>th</sup> graders).
- Teachers all teachers are returning the next school year.
- Field Trips: The following trips are planned for students:
  - College Field Trip BPA students will be visiting CSUN on 4/18/23 every year students will visit 4 different universities.
  - Disneyland students will be taking a trip to Disneyland to participate in a leadership training program.
  - o Camp Semi in June BPA students will go Catalina Island.
  - San Juan Capistrano in May students will take the Amtrack at Union Station to study native American history in San Juan Capistrano.
- NWEA testing results will be shared next month 90% of students demonstrated learning growth of 3% and some students experienced double-digit growth.

#### FINANCIAL REPORTING

Mr. Thurman introduced the financials for February. BPA is financially healthy as indicated in the income statement and corresponding reports. Average Daily Attendance (ADA) is 128 and was budged for 140 students, BPA is slightly under. The school's revenue is \$2.5 million with a \$394,000 surplus.

# APPROVAL OF LOS ANGELES INSTITUTE OF RIGHT-BRAIN PRACTICES & RESEARCH (LAIRP) CONTRACT

Carlos Alvarez, CEO of LAIRP provided an overview of the Los Angeles Institute of the Right-Brain Practices and Research. LAIRP will provide professional development to BPA's teachers to engage and promote positive student behavioral interventions. They also provide curricula for students, training to parents and mentoring for administrative leads.

This program will be complementing BPA's work as an MTSS site and will meet requirements set for the CCSPP grant.

Actual training topics are yet to be determined because LAIRP needs to conduct a needs assessment to customize the training. Total cost of the program is \$33,909. LAIRP has agreed to cover the cost of data collection using a program called Dean's List, which is a behavior tracking system.

#### APPROVAL TO CONTRACT LACOE'S PBIS TRAINING

LACOE's approached BPA to participate in their Positive Behavior Interventions and Support program for the next two years. LAIRP will put the systems in place to track interventions and PBIS will provide actual consulting and student behavioral training services using a 3-tier system.
